10% Tuition Reduction—

IAIA is implementing a 10% decrease in tuition for the 2020-2021 academic year, and this new cost does include all required textbooks as well. We have made this decrease to make it easier for students to continue their education towards an Associate's or Bachelor's degree. This is the new base tuition rate for the upcoming academic year—there is no application needed to receive the decrease.

Connectivity Assistance—

For those current and potential students who may face challenges due to low quality or total lack of connectivity to the Internet, IAIA is offering assistance through loaned laptops and tablets, aid for enhanced Internet services, and increased data plans for mobile phones.

The Quest for a Degree—

Studies show that students who complete their degree program in four years have a greater degree of career success than students who take five or more years to finish—and many students who don't complete their program in four years are less likely to receive their degree for a variety of reasons. IAIA is doing everything to assist students so that they don't lose any time in their quest for a degree.

Not a Loss, but an Opportunity-

With over ten years of experience in online learning, IAIA has a distinct advantage in finding creative ways to shift traditional art courses to an online environment. These are uncertain times, and IAIA is remaining flexible, so whether we return to campus in the fall with hybridized studio courses, or deliver courses solely online—we see this upcoming academic year not as a loss, but an opportunity to come together and push the boundaries of virtual learning.
