ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

This 2+2 articulation agreement is between the Institute of American Indian Arts (IAIA) in Santa Fe, New Mexico and San Juan College (SJC), Farmington, NM for the purpose of stating the conditions under which students seeking transfer of admission to IAIA will receive credit for successful completion of courses and/or programs offered by SJC.

AGREEMENT RECITAL

Whereas, success with the Institute of American Indian Arts depends upon several factors, including, artistic and academic potential, the motivation to develop the potential, sound work habits, and for the transfer student, appropriate placement with a given curriculum at IAIA.

Whereas, the current catalog of SJC has been reviewed and up to date, to determine the extent to which students who have completed the Associate of Applied Science, in Digital Media & Design may transfer into the Bachelor of Arts (BFA) Cinematic Arts & Technology program at IAIA.

Therefore, the parties hereby agree as follows:

REVIEW OF APPLICANT'S ACADEMIC RECORD

The academic record (Official Transcript) of each applicant to IAIA who has attended SJC will be evaluated to determine their potential for success in the BFA Cinematic Arts & Technology program at IAIA. The outcome of this evaluation will determine the number of transfer credits and the student's status within the given BFA Cinematic Arts & Technology curriculum.

REVIEW GUIDLINES

The following will be used for the review process under this Articulation Agreement:

1. SJC students who successfully complete the Associate of Applied Science, in Digital Media & Design degree will be admitted to the Institute of American Indian Arts, BFA-Cinematic Arts & Technology program. SJC students must have a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 2.0 or higher.

2. Admissions requirements for SJC students include:
 - Application (application fee is waived through this articulation)
 - Official Transcripts from all previously attended colleges/universities
 - Official SJC Transcript listing degree is conferred.
 - Meet Admissions Deadline: August 4, for Fall semester and Dec. 4 for Spring semester (The applicants will be notified of their admissions status via phone; email and regular mail delivery.)

3. A BFA degree plan will be included for the applicant's review and signature. It is the applicant's responsibility for the return of the form to the admissions office

RESPONSIBILITIES of Institutions:

SJC agrees to accept responsibility for the following:

- a. Assist in identifying and recruiting students for collaborative 2+ 2 programs. Distribute updated degree and transfer materials to alumni and current students.
- b. Provide facilities/classroom for collaborative programs, courses as agreed upon on a semester basis related to the 2+2 agreement.
- c. Support SJC/IAIA articulation/transfer efforts/2+2 agreements.

IAIA agrees to accept responsibility for the following:

- a. Designate a staff member to serve as a liaison between IAIA and SJC.
- b. Identify IAIA resources to assist in the development of collaborative programs.
- c. Assist in identifying and recruiting students for collaborative programs.
- d. Provide facilities for collaborative programs as agreed upon on a semester basis related to the 2+2 agreement.
- e. Support SJC/IAIA articulation/transfer efforts/2 +2 agreements.
- f. Charge SJC students the current IAIA tuition rate.



Further review of this Articulation Agreement may be necessary as changes occur within the curriculum at either institution. At the request of the Institute of American Indian Arts or SJC a review of this document will be conducted by both parties.

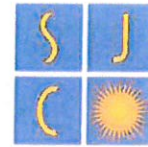

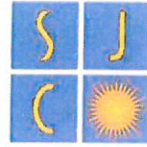
